
### He Went From Moppet To Mentor

The story of Englewood's Paul Powers could have been written by Charles Dickens. He grew up in Milford, Massachusetts in a family of modest means, and his childhood was not what one would call ideal. His parents were strict disciplinarians. He recalls that "my father was the High Lord Executioner, and my mother was the Chief Prosecutor. It was a very conflicted household, and I was glad to get out of there when I was 18." He was labeled an "indifferent" student in elementary school, who got good grades in the courses he liked and poor grades in the others. His father decided that he needed to be subjected to some stricter handling by the nuns at Marian High School in Framingham, a Catholic institution, and he got it. There was no time for sports,

and he had what he calls "a regular schedule of detentions" for real or alleged rules infractions, which frequently caused him to miss the school bus. He had to hitchhike home, because his parents wouldn't make the 90-minute roundtrip ride to the school and back. "Their attitude was that I got in trouble, so it was up to me to deal with the consequences." It was a harsh lesson, but a valuable one.

Paul did find relief in music. He was a member of the high school band while still in grade school, and he played the organ in church on Sundays. He graduated from high school in 1970, when the unpopular war in Vietnam was in full swing. He was interested in politics and thought he might like to get a law degree, but he knew his name was coming up at the local U.S. Army draft board, and rather than get drafted, he volunteered for the U.S. Marine Corps. Say what? Well, there was a method in his madness. Having survived the disciplinary trials of his parents and the nuns, he was ready for some REAL

discipline in the military. He got it at Paris Island in basic training and Camp Lejeune in combat training. "I started at the bottom as a buck private and worked my way up to a noncom rank in 13 months. It was good for me," he says. "I got over my fear of heights and risk-taking, and built my confidence in myself." It made him a man.

Though his unit was deployed to Nam, he missed out through a typical military mixup, and he ended up at Camp Pendleton in sunny southern California as a communications specialist. While there he found time to take a couple of night school courses for college credit as well. Paul was released from active duty in 1972 (though he didn't get his honorable discharge until he completed another four years in the inactive reserve). When he got home he applied to Harvard University under the GI Bill and was accepted, but he felt out of place in its Ivy League way of life and the strong antiwar atmosphere there. After one semester he switched to the University of Massachusetts in Amherst. It was a move that changed his life and career.

At UMass he got a single room under a work/study program, and as a Massachusetts veteran his tuition was waived. "All I had to do was pay for my meals," he recalls, so he had the



financial means to keep on going to school – earning a bachelor's degree in psychology in 1974, a master's degree in psychology in 1975 and a doctorate in psychology in 1979. That gave him status and opportunity: a doctorate degree is a key that will open many doors. He would just have to decide which door – or doors – to open.

Paul gained valuable experience in cognitive behavioral therapy during his years at UMass by working with patients at the nearby Veterans Administration hospital in Northampton. Most patients were being treated for what was called post-traumatic stress disorder or PTSD. "What I learned is that PTSD is not a disorder, it is a natural reaction to stress, just as pulling your finger away from a hot stove is. If we could get the patient to accept that premise and then get involved in any activity to occupy his time and thoughts, he could get through it." It was a valuable lesson that could be applied to many situations: accept your condition as a natural reaction and do something about it. "We were getting them jobs, apprenticeships, getting them out of the hospital and not coming back. In 1977 the head of the VA authorized a study of all its hospitals, and we had the lowest recidivism rate in the country. A colleague and I wrote up our program, and the VA assigned us to visit all its hospitals in the country – he in the west and me in the east – and tell them what we were doing. The VA turned me into a consultant!"

Paul did a postdoctoral year

in Boston and took a part-time job with University Center, Inc., a private practice firm that did vocational counseling and management training. When his boss at the firm retired in 1981, Paul left too. "He was my chief, my companion, my mentor," he avers. "There was nothing there for me once he left." While getting his license from the state that year, Paul noticed a lot of errors and inconsistencies in the process, and he wrote an article criticizing it. Lo and behold, he soon got a call from Governor Ed King's office, asking him to come in and talk to the Governor himself. The visit resulted in his getting appointed to the Massachusetts Board of Registration in Psychology. While it was a nonpaying assignment, it was a feather in his hat that added to his experience and visibility in the field of management psychology.

After leaving UCI, Paul connected with the owner of a successful employment agency who was starting a separate entity called Keystone Associates, which would provide outplacement counseling and assistance for executives who had been fired or resigned their job in a dispute. It was a new field then, and over a period of three years it gave Paul experience and contacts with high-level executives at companies large and small.

He left Keystone in 1985, the year he married Linda Spitzer, a commercial artist and designer and a friend of his secretary at Keystone. "Our first date was on August 10, 1984, and I married

her a year later on August 10," he recalls. "She was, and still is, the nicest person I have ever met." That's at least one reason they're still together after 37 years and counting.

Paul's next job was with an executive search company, Fenwick, which had clients mostly in the high-tech sector, many of them located along Route 128 in the Bedford/ Lexington area. This was in one sense a complete switch from outplacement. Now he was helping owners and senior executives find highly qualified men and women to join their firm. This involved consulting with them on their needs, finding and interviewing candidates, arranging for them to meet their potential boss, winnowing the list of candidates, doing extensive background checks on the final few candidates in some cases, and helping in the negotiations in many cases. It also involved extensive travel to visit the candidates in their home cities. "I spent time in every airline club in the country," Paul swears. But it was a lucrative business, it broadened Paul's experience and kept him in touch with high-level executives around the country.

In 1988 he decided to go into business for himself. His company: Dr. Paul Powers, Management Psychologist. A lot of his contacts were young and new in business, who understood the technology but were inexperienced in solving the many problems of personnel management that come up in business. "I became in effect their consigliere, offering them counsel," he says. "One of my clients told me, 'I pay you to be around because I enjoy your company, you keep me from being stupid, and you're cheaper than a lawyer.'"

Paul's business thrived, and it found him giving seminars, making appearances on TV and radio and writing articles, newsletters and books - his first one entitled "Love Your Job," a perfect metaphor for his philosophy. During that time, he says he and Linda "made an active decision to spend about 10 percent of our time on pro-bono activities that were in line with our values. Being our own bosses gave us the flexibility and time to do that, and it gave us both a lot of personal satisfaction." But in 2006, after 25-plus years of full-time activity, he and Linda decided to cut back a bit. They sold their house in Wellesley and moved to the small town of Englewood, Florida. "We love it here," he says. "It's got music, beaches, some good restaurants, and it's close to Venice and Sarasota, which have many excellent cultural and social activities to offer."

But "cutting back" is strictly a relative term. Having already established himself as an author, a motivational speaker and a frequent guest on television and radio shows, he became what he calls a "retirement coach" as well, offering his expertise to those folks entering their golden years. His just-published humorous book on becoming a husband is one example. Another is an e-newsletter he's created entitled "LifeMap," giving common-sense advice on spending your efforts. Some sample topics: "Remembrance & Appreciation," "The Gift of Laughter," 'Four-day Work Week," and "Social Connections = Better Health."

Suffice it to say that Paul's not done, but he has lived a life that took him from a troubled beginning to one of fulfillment and success. Even Charles Dickens himself couldn't have sketched the scenario any better.


#### THE WHALE

A highlight of this year's awards season was watching Brendan Fraser, star of *The Mummy* and *George of the Jungle*, win big for his comeback role in *The Whale*. You couldn't help but be moved by his emotional speeches even if like most people, you hadn't seen the movie.

I finally did see *The Whale* on demand this weekend, and have to agree with most critics that Fraser is great, but the film, not so much.

Fraser plays Charlie, a morbidly obese man who refuses to seek medical care even though he knows he's dying of heart disease. *The Whale* is based on a play by Samuel D. Hunter and the film feels like a play, as it takes place entirely in Charlie's house. He's visited by his loyal friend and nurse Liz, a door-todoor missionary, and eventually and his estranged 17-year-old daughter, Ellie.

At first, you'll spend a lot of time staring at Fraser and marveling at the magic of the Oscar-winning movie make-up and prosthetics that transform his appearance. It takes everything for Charlie to move from the couch to the kitchen or bathroom. He lumbers. He wheezes. His friend and nurse Liz (Hong Chau) begs him to go



to the hospital or he will die but he refuses to go. Charlie is a bit of a martyr.

We learn that Charlie left his wife and child to be with the man he loved, whose death, it is implied, led to Charlie's eating disorder. In an effort to make things right, Charlie reaches out to Ellie after many years. What he gets is an angry, meanspirited, snarky, teenager who as a bonus is flunking out of school. And boy is she mad at Dad! Charlie promises that he will rewrite her essays to keep her from failing, and give her money if she keeps visiting.

But *The Whale* isn't about an annoying girl who hates her dad and everyone else on the planet. It's about watching Brendan Fraser inhabit and maneuver this enormous body, which is fascinating and a bit creepy at the same time. It's difficult to watch Charlie eat, like he is battling his food, and to watch him use a pulley to get out of bed. Every move is difficult, deliberate and potentially dangerous. But thanks to Fraser, it's believable.

Charlie's only goal is to set things right with his daughter, who he insists is amazing. But the only thing she's amazing at is scowling, stomping and brooding. Deeper in the movie we learn more about their history, and we learn about Charlie's partner, but it was tough for me to feel bad for Charlie or Ellie. I did feel for Liz, and for Charlie's ex-wife (the always great Samantha Morton) who arrives later in the movie for a moving scene and validation that Ellie is "evil."

Fraser deserves all the praise and prizes he received for *The Whale*, as does Chau who was nominated for an Oscar and is the most authentic character in the movie. Too bad *The Whale* isn't as good as they are.

#### BABYLON

In 2016's musical drama *La La Land*, Director Damian Chazelle exquisitely captured modern day Hollywood and took



home the Best Director Oscar. So, the studio handed him an \$80 million budget, creative control and a stellar cast to do the same with 1920's Hollywood. But in this case, bigger is definitely not better.

*Babylon* flopped big-time and is available on Paramount+. It follows the trajectory of several characters who may or may not be based on actual film legends. Margot Robbie plays brash silent starlet Nellie LaRoy (maybe Clara Bow). Brad Pitt is harddrinking, oft-married fading movie idol Jack Conrad (maybe John Gilbert). Diego Calva is Manny, your standard ambitious new guy who works his way to the top.


The movie name-drops real Hollywood legends like Irving Thalberg, Mabel Normand and Gary Cooper and an early scene depicts the Fatty Arbuckle scandal. I give Chazelle credit for including the difficulties faced by minorities in Hollywood. I just wish that Li Jun Li as the cool and sophisticated Lady Fay Zhu (maybe Anna May Wong) and Jovan Adepo as Sydney Palmer, a talented Black musician, had more screen time.

The characters are potentially compelling but with nobody to keep Chazelle in check, Babylon constantly runs off the rails. There is so much screaming, swearing, running and releasing of body fluids that the story gets lost. And in an extraordinarily bold and questionable move, Chazelle throws in the song "Singin' in the Rain" reminding us of a movie that told the story about Hollywood in the time of talkies so much better, and Babylon ends with multiple clips from that classic movie. Ouch.

*Babylon* is an ambitious, showy, chaotic, sprawling film with moments of brilliance, especially a montage at the very end, a fabulous soundtrack and eye-popping production values, but ultimately, it's a chaotic, overlong, noisy mess. Give me Singin' in the Rain any day.



# Windy Days For Shore Fishing

It doesn't take much wind to blow kayaks off the bay. We are cautious about kayak fishing on days where the wind is from the north or south and whitecaps take over Lemon Bay and most other north/south oriented waters. There are still spots to fish and escape the wind, but these places are more limited than on those days with the wind out of the east or west. Folks around here know that a sea breeze blows most afternoons, even on those days that start with an easterly wind. Be prepared to switch lee sides on the bay as this sea breeze develops. That means crossing Lemon Bay twice, so pick a narrow spot like Oyster Creek or Lemon Bay Park to start and end your day. Or launch at Blind Pass and deal with the wind until the sea breeze kicks in.

Of course, shore fishing is an alternative on windy days. That includes both salt and freshwater spots. The persistent red tide has finally diminished and blown out to sea. This opens up the beaches for anglers hoping to find live fish. Many fish died but lots of them survived and are again showing up along our beaches. There are a couple of things you need to know first.

One thing is that Florida beaches are public property but only up to the high tide line. So, just stay down by the water on the wet or smooth sand to avoid conflicts with beach properties that claim a private beach. Your best access points are public beaches where you can park, get to the water and fish, avoiding swimmers while also avoiding private properties.

Another thing we want folks to know as they visit our beaches this spring is to wear protective footwear on the dry sand areas. After Hurricane Ian, lots of debris including broken glass, metal, nails, and screws littered the beach and not all of



it has been found and removed. Another hazard requiring sandals is the presence of dead fish skeletons from the red tide event we recently experienced. Lying partially buried in the sand, needle sharp fish bones can poke you with putrefied, bacteria covered stuff you really don't want to deal with.

Even though the red tide has dissipated, it still caused a mass die off of fish at all levels in the food chain. Starting with sand fleas and coquina at the bottom of the food chain, which were nearly wiped out. It will take time for the surf to scrub the sand of toxins so these organisms can return. Until then, bring shrimp or blanched sand fleas from the bait store if you're planning a fish fry, though we encourage catch and release to help our fish populations recover.

We recently began a search of good, accessible bass lakes in this area for shore fishing and were surprised at the number of bass in the ponds at Ann Dever Regional Park off of San Casa Drive. The pond south of the swimming pool was the best, but mostly smaller fish were released. We were encouraged though and plan to return soon to find the larger bass that must be there too. Due to the vegetation on the bottom of these ponds, a lightly weighted or unweighted plastic worm rigged weedless was a good choice in the middle of the day. At sunset, there was more surface activity suggesting a popping bug with a fly rod might be something else to try.
