I Stream, You Stream! Unless...

If you are of a certain age, you probably remember complaining to your parents, "Nothing's on TV." Now, even with the writers' strike stopping production on talk shows and scripted series, with just one paid streaming service, you likely have more shows available than you have time to watch.

However, if you have been putting off watching a particular show, you might be out of luck. In what my daughter Emma cleverly labeled "merge and purge," streaming networks are joining forces to combine content and save money. With mergers like Disney+ and Hulu and whatever is happening at HBO, shows and movies that have been around for years may disappear or only be available for rental.

In order to save money, streaming services are downsizing inventory and pushing content to the rentalverse. Already gone are *The Lord of the Rings* Trilogy, the first three *Spiderman* movies and one of my personal all-time favorite movies *Jerry Maguire*, which is leaving Netflix on July 1.

Iconic HBO shows like *The Sopranos* and popular new series like *The Last of Us* are safe from "merge and purge." However, if you're a fan of the HBO science fiction hit *Westworld* and didn't quite finish the final season, you'll have to pay about \$2.99 per episode from a service like Google Play to watch even if you are still subscribing to Max.

HBO Max subscribers don't have to do anything to benefit from its parent Warner Bros. streaming consolidation, as the new Max adds programing from Discovery including HGTV and the Food Network. Of course, then you have to choose if you want your home renovation programs with ads or if you want to up your viewing game to Max Ultimate Ad Free for a few more dollars a month.



One way to get more content is to combine streaming services. Bundling isn't just for Flo from Progressive. Now you can purchase bundles like Disney Trio (Disney+, ESPN+ and Hulu) which recently became available for \$12.99 a month.

This week Paramount Global combined Paramount+ and its Showtime app. You can stick with just Paramount+ and keep watching for \$5.99 a month (up from \$4.99) or move up to Paramount+ with Showtime for \$11.99. And yes, that's the name of the service.

So now that you've decided what services to keep and what to cancel, how do you decide which programs to watch? You can eliminate the guesswork by following the "We think you'll like" or "based on your viewing" recommendations on your home screen. That sometimes works. It led me to *Bad Sisters* on Apple+ and *Jewish Matchmaking* on Netflix. Would I be watching *Merpeople* right now if it hadn't shown up on my recommendations? Probably

not, and then I'd never know all about these crazy kids who are determined to become professional mermaids despite the risk of hypothermia, tail breakage and other "findustry" perils.

Unfortunately, the all-knowing viewing advisors at Netflix also suggested Your Place or Mine, a trivial, chemistry-free romcom with Reese Witherspoon and Ashton Kutcher. Netflix was wrong again with Glamorous, a badly-written "non-com" that debuted June 22. I can see why my past viewing of the original Sex and the City, The Mindy Project and Emily in Paris (which Netflix could not possibly know that I only watch for the clothes and the scenery), would lead the all-knowing streamer to suggest Glamorous. It took all of 17 minutes for me to know they were wrong.

I do give my streamers credit. I almost never watch horror, reality shows and science fiction so those genres are rarely recommended to me. I am also intrigued by some of the creatively named categories like "Easy-To-Watch-TV." What exactly does that mean? Why is *Only Murders in the Building* easier to watch than say *Arrested Development*?

I find that a more successful method of program selection is to make my daughter Emma watch the first episode of a potential show and report back if I'd like it or not. She's right almost every time. I also suggest checking out the ratings and reviews at rottentomatoes.com. If I had done that I would have seen that *Your Place or Mine* scored a 36. Spoiler alert: that's not great.

Recently my friend found herself living the dream when she learned she would have the house to herself for nearly a week. That meant total control of the TV and the time to start powering through the backlog of shows in her queue. She asked her friends, including me, "What should I watch?" If more than one of us insisted she would enjoy a certain show, she watched it, and loved it. Sorry streamers, you don't know best.

The Englewood Amateur Radio Society (EARS) participated in the Summer American Radio Relav League Field Day event, "Tune in the World", the weekend of June 24/25 at Ann & Chuck Dever Regional Park. The club contacted 80 different stations, ranging from British Columbia to New York to South Dakota. The club members are just a few of 750,000 active ham radio license holders in the US. The public generally knows these enthusiasts by the moniker Ham Radio Operator. Part of the attraction is the thrill of communicating with other operators from around the country and different parts of the world depending on radio frequency signal strength and weather conditions. Start-up costs for an operator aren't that expensive. You can purchase a simple radio transmitter for around \$50 and there are signal relays,

"repeaters", in this area that can relay your signal farther than the radio's actual range. Training can be obtained through workshops offered by area clubs and online. To become certified, you take a test by the FCC and then receive your radio call name, a combination of letters and a number.

number. Besides the fun of communicating with operators around the country and internationally, some individuals volunteer to serve their community during emergencies as a liaison with area law enforcement and emergency management. They provided Charlotte County Emergency Management with important feedback on real time conditions after Hurricane Ian. Two members. Steve Malone (KN4YIV) and his wife, Shirley Duke (KN4YIU), are members of CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) with

Charlotte County. One of the training modules offered was ham radio which they took and became active club members. Michael Reid (N3MR) started as a young man listening to short wave radio back in the 1960s and became a ham radio operator to be able to talk with the people he was listening to. Club treasurer Bob McAlister (KN4RKE) says, "You can have awful lot of fun being a ham operator." He would like to see more young people get involved and experience the fun of communicating with others and building friendships through ham radio.





Stump Pass

Recently, after avoiding one of our favorite launches for outstanding kayak water all winter, we ventured back to Stump Pass Beach State Park. During high season, parking issues, combined with the ongoing reconstruction of the utility building, made this a challenging launch. There was another launch at the north end of the lot that backed up to the water but at this time, only the southern launch with the stairs is available. Due to the small size of this parking lot, no trailers are allowed.

So, after months of season, we were surprised to find plenty of parking available including two prime spots by the kayak launch. This park opens at 8 AM daily and closes one half hour after sunset. We got there on a weekday just after opening to find good spots. By the time we returned at 4:30 PM, the lot was full but beginning to empty out.

Most kayak anglers know about "ski alley", technically known as Petersen Cut where the launch is located. Not so obvious from water level is another channel to the east of Petersen Island that has no high-speed boat traffic. This has always been our favorite channel to kayak and fish. Defined by Petersen Island to the west and Whidden Key to the east, this spot is protected from all but a Northwest wind.

We don't know the name for this channel, but it has plenty of grass with navigable water for boats but the deeper water meanders back and forth which makes it tricky for boaters. This serpentine flow creates a multitude of shallow bars and grass flats where tidal currents move bait on both outgoing and incoming tides. Add this topography in the channel to the myriad mangroves that line both sides and you'll see why we like it here.




Stump Pass

On this particular day, we had a huge high tide in midafternoon, so we headed east to paddle around the east side of Whidden Key then south towards Stump Pass. We wanted to explore the shallow flats that extend a half mile east to the ICW. Kimball fished out by the ICW, catching numerous large spotted seatrout, while Les kept working the mangroves looking for redfish taking advantage of the high tide to forage back among the roots. The tide was still incoming when we rounded the south end of Whidden Key which made paddling west a challenge. We recommend caution around Stump Pass, particularly if you are paddling over the shallow sand bars. Boat wakes, while manageable in deep water, tend to be amplified over these shallow spots.

We have kayaked there many times but this day, with the extreme high tide, we explored a narrow cut on the southern end of Whidden Key. It led into a small, shallow lagoon that was stacked with juvenile snook, mangrove snapper and sheepshead. We may have spooked them, but as the tide was peaking, these fish realized that they would soon be high and dry in this lagoon. We saw schools of 50 snook swimming under our kayaks. These little snook portend good days ahead for the fishery. Kimball caught and released an example of the snook we saw.

The usual afternoon thunderstorms began to rumble over the mainland, so we headed north and back towards the kayak launch. We don't mind fishing in the rain but when the electrical storms show up, we call it a day. Being in a kayak makes us the highest point around but it's our graphite rods that create the biggest hazard.

The best part of this trip was the incredibly clear water around the pass. We enjoyed remarkable clarity after a winter of red tide and windy flats with marginal visibility for spotting fish. Kayak anglers should take advantage of this clarity and launch early to avoid electrical issues in the afternoon. This clear water won't last as the summer algae bloom gets underway so enjoy it while it's here.

Nature Calls



Fireworks: Bad News for Shorebirds & Sea Turtles! Fireworks are a favorite part of July 4th celebrations but not everyone is thrilled by them. Nesting shorebirds and sea turtles are two examples that suffer as the result of fireworks being shot off on the beaches along the Gulf. Fireworks are bright, loud and deadly to nesting shorebirds, if they are displayed too close to a colony nesting on the beach. Fireworks are prohibited at Stump Pass Beach State Park, and at all Florida State Parks. According to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, adult Least Terns completely abandoned a nesting site that was a football field away from a fireworks display. Their report notes that fireworks within three quarters of a mile also caused birds distress and they temporarily abandoned eggs and chicks. When the adults are frightened away, the eggs in their nest or their tiny chicks can easily be eaten by gulls, raccoons, fish crows or other predators. Sea turtles, which are nesting on the beaches now, are interrupted in their nesting efforts and may be stressed by the lights and the noise. Hatchlings may get disoriented. The beach is a bad place for fireworks, which stress wildlife and create pollution for marine creatures. Last year, Coastal Wildlife Club turtle patrol volunteers found a disoriented adult loggerhead on the landward side of a house. She had crawled from the beach through a yard and into the street several houses away, likely disoriented by the lights and noise of fireworks. Keeping the beach dark will go a long way in preventing incidents like this. This photo shows how much the night is lit up when fireworks are shot off.

County Protects Land Along Curry Creek

During their March 7th meeting, the Sarasota County Board of County Commissioners approved the purchase of 32 acres formally known as Edmondson Farms, Inc. The county purchased the land as a fee simple purchase through the Environmentally Sensitive Lands Protection Program (ESLPP). In addition to archaeological features, the property is home to the historic headwaters of Curry Creek and the baygall swamp, mesic hammock and pasture provides crucial habitat for native wildlife, like a variety

of wading birds, eastern grey squirrels, and gopher tortoises. Public access to Curry Creek Preserve will be expanded with a trail and preserve entrance planned for the future. The ESLPP is a voter-approved and taxpayer-funded program that began in 1999 to acquire and protect environmental land. Since its inception, the ESLPP has protected and preserved more than 40,300 acres of natural habitat, with more than 21,000 of those acres placed under a conservation easement. Three members of Girl Scouts of Gulfcoast Florida Troop 617 of Englewood are building beach toy borrow bins and, pending approval, the bins will be placed at Stump Pass Beach State Park and Englewood Beach at Chadwick Park at the end of summer. The bins the girls are building are intended to lessen plastic waste by helping reduce the amount of discarded beach toys left on the beach by providing toys to be borrowed by visitors to the beach. Additional toys can be added to the bins by families who don't want to take their sand buckets, shovels, and other toys home, repurposing the toys for other children to use while at the beach. "We are building bins for beach toys because plastic hurts sea life and water. Beach toys end up in the ocean when left on the beach," explained Violet, age 12, who has been scouting since age 5. Carol McCoy, who helps monitor local beaches for sea turtle activity through Coastal Wildlife Club, has given the Girl Scouts a bag containing more than 30 plastic toys she has picked up during her beach patrols. She shared with the girls that there are 105-500 pieces of plastic found in every sea turtle, according to a global study. To build the bins, the Girl Scouts are using a wood-alternative material that stands up to Florida weather and was donated by EZ Dock Marine. Home Depot also supported the project. Rhonda Harvey, of Keep Charlotte Beautiful, is serving as the Girl Scouts' Silver Award project advisor. Nicole Hopkins is the volunteer troop leader. Those wishing to donate toys before the borrow bins are placed at the beach can drop them off in a bin that is on display outside the office at Redeemer Lutheran School, 6970 Mineola Rd, Englewood. 

The Florida Department of Health in Sarasota and Manatee Counties (DOH-Sarasota and DOH-Manatee) have issued a mosquito-borne illness alert for Sarasota and Manatee Counties. On May 26, 2023, the DOH released information on the first confirmed local case of malaria, who was treated and has recovered. Since then, three more cases have been confirmed, and the patients are being treated. Residents in these areas should take precautions, such as wearing long sleeve shirts and pants, applying bug spray, and avoiding areas with high mosquito populations, especially during sunrise and sunset when mosquitos are most active. Malaria is NOT transmitted from person to person. Only infected Anopheles mosquitoes can transmit malaria to humans. This case has been identified as the P. vivax species of malaria, which is not as fatal as other species and effective treatment is readily available through



hospitals and other health care providers. Individuals in this area with symptoms of fever, chills, sweats, nausea/vomiting, and headache should seek immediate medical attention.

The Department continues to conduct statewide surveillance for mosquitoborne illnesses, including West Nile virus infections, Eastern equine encephalitis, St. Louis encephalitis, malaria, chikungunya, and dengue. Residents of Florida are encouraged to report dead birds to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission at app.myfwc.com/FWRI/AvianMortality/.

DOH-Sarasota and DOH-Manatee continue to advise the public to remain diligent in their personal mosquito protection efforts by remembering to "Drain and Cover".

DRAIN standing water to stop mosquitoes from multiplying.

- Drain water from garbage cans, house gutters, buckets, pool covers, coolers, toys, flowerpots, or any other containers where sprinkler or rainwater has collected.
- Discard old tires, drums, bottles, cans, pots and pans, broken appliances and other items that aren't being used.
- Empty and clean birdbaths and pet's water bowls at least once or twice a week
- Protect boats and vehicles from rain with tarps that don't accumulate water.
- Maintain swimming pools in good condition and keep appropriately chlorinated.
 Empty plastic swimming pools when not in use.

COVER skin with clothing or repellent.

 Clothing - Wear shoes, socks, and long pants and long-sleeves. This type of protection may be necessary for people who must work in areas where mosquitoes are present.

- Repellent Apply mosquito repellent to bare skin and clothing.
- Always use repellents according to the label.
 Repellents with DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, para-menthanediol, 2-undecanone, and IR3535 are effective.
- Use mosquito netting to protect children younger than 2 months old.


Tips on Repellent Use

- Always read label directions carefully for the approved usage before you apply a repellent. Some repellents are not suitable for children.
- In protecting children, read label instructions to be sure the repellent is age appropriate. Mosquito repellents containing oil of lemon eucalyptus or para-menthane-diol should not be used on children under the age of three years. DEET is not recommended on children younger than two months old.
- Avoid applying repellents to the hands of children. Adults

should apply repellent first to their own hands and then transfer it to the child's skin and clothing.

- Apply insect repellent that contains DEET (10-30%), picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, para-menthanediol, 2-undecanone or IR3535. These products are generally available at local pharmacies. Look for active ingredients to be listed on the product label.
- Apply insect repellent to exposed skin, or onto clothing, but not under clothing.
- Treat clothing and gear with products containing 0.5% permethrin. Do not apply permethrin directly to skin. Always follow the manufacturer's directions.
- For more information on what repellent is right for you, consider using the Environmental Protection Agency's search tool to help you choose skin-applied repellent products: cfpub.epa. gov/oppref/insect/#searchform. COVER doors and windows with screens to keep mosquitoes out of your house. Repair broken screening on windows, doors, porches, and patios.




