

Mosquito-Borne Malaria Advisory

On June 26th, the Florida Department of Health issued a statewide mosquito-borne illness advisory following six confirmed and recovered local cases of malaria in Sarasota County. All individuals have been treated and have recovered. Malaria is transmitted through infected mosquitoes. Residents throughout the state should take precautions by applying bug spray, avoiding areas with high mosquito populations, and wearing long pants and shirts when possible - especially during sunrise and sunset when mosquitos are most active. In Florida, malaria is transmitted through infected Anopheles

mosquitoes. The cause of malaria in these cases has been identified as the Plasmodium vivax species. Effective treatment is readily available through hospitals and other health care providers. Individuals in this area with symptoms of fever, chills, sweats, nausea/vomiting, and headache should seek immediate medical attention. For more information, visit floridahealth.

Hidden Disabilities Sunflower Program

The Indian Challents Sunface Layered
Assisting adults and children
with hidden disabilities

In order to better serve the public, the Charlotte County Airport Authority at the Punta Gorda Airport now participates in the Hidden Disabilities Sunflower Program. While some individuals experience a disability that is visible, others have a non-visible disability that is not immediately apparent to others. That disability may be neurological, cognitive, neurodevelopmental, visual, auditory, respiratory, or a chronic condition. Airport staff, TSA, and airline partners are being oriented to this new program so they can help recognize adults and children with hidden disabilities who may require additional time, a helping hand, or simply understanding in navigating the airport. Passengers can request a Sunflower Lanyard that will help alert personnel discreetly to ask if assistance is required. A Sunflower Lanyard can be requested by contacting CThames@FlyPGD.com or call **941-205-3276** at least seven days prior to your arrival at the airport. A lanyard may be mailed to you or made available for pickup. You can learn more about the Hidden Disability Sunflower Program at hdsunflower.com/us.

system's transition to the Breeze brand. OnDemand by Sarasota County will now be known as Breeze OnDemand. There are four Breeze OnDemand service zones: Downtown Sarasota/Lido Key/Longboat Key, Siesta Key, Venice/ Englewood area and North Port area. Rides cost \$2 per person and must start and stop within the same service zone. There is a \$1.50 Breeze OnDemand rate for Transportation Disadvantaged riders (certified through the Breeze Transit office). OnDemand hours are

Monday through Saturday, 5 am to 10 pm, and Sunday, 6 am to 9 pm. The Breeze OnDemand system connects to the Breeze fixed route service, creating a countywide mobility network. 

assistance with electric bills. Low-Income Home Energy Assistance is available once in a 12-month period to eligible households based on monthly gross income, to help offset the cost of home energy. Applications will be accepted through June 30, 2024, or until all funds are expended. Low-Income Home Energy CRISIS Assistance may also be available to households with the power off, a past due bill, final notice or security deposit. Applications will be accepted through June 30, 2024, or until all funds are expended. Emergency Home Energy Assistance Program, sponsored by the Department of Elder Affairs and the Area Agency on Aging of SW Florida and administered by Charlotte County Human Services may have funds available for those households with at least one member 60 years of age or older and a past due energy bill. Applications will be accepted through June 30, 2024, or until all funds are expended. Don't wait for final notice from FPL. Water Bill Assistance

The Charlotte County Human Services Department is now accepting applications for assistance with water bills. 



Support Bees with a Bee Pollinator Home 🦠

Pollinator homes support solitary bees, providing a cozy nesting site. The U.S. has around 4,000 species of native bees. Ninety percent of them are solitary nesters using reeds, hollow logs or underground burrows as homes. Bees are everywhere and every yard has bees, whether you know it or not. Bees find their favorite flowers by color and scent; a colorful and aromatic native bee garden is a pollinators paradise.

These solitary bees do not make honey, are non-aggressive, and they do not swarm. Wild bees go dormant and hibernate in Southwest Florida during the winter. Most solitary bee species will overwinter in a birth cell, either as new, fully developed adults not yet emerged from their cells, or as pupae, waiting to complete their development and seek sheltered spaces, such as our newly constructed pollinator houses. Bee populations continue to decline, so these houses will help our very important pollinators to survive. Over 85% of U.S. households have an outdoor living space. If every one of those households created much needed habitat in their yard or garden, together we could have a big impact.

Birds, bats, butterflies, beetles, and other small animals also pollinate plants and are responsible for bringing us one out of every three bites of food. Pollinators also sustain our ecosystems and produce our natural resources by helping plants to reproduce. You can help pollinators by placing bee houses, providing clean water and limiting the use of pesticides in your yards and neighborhoods. No lawn, garden, balcony or window box is too small. Bees visit flowers to collect nectar (carbohydrates to power their flight) and pollen (providing protein, oils and minerals needed by bee larvae.)

What can bees do for me?

There are several reasons for finding bees desirable in your yard. Bees are a critical part of natural environments, and they provide a valuable service to

humans when they pollinate our fruit and vegetable plants and wildflowers. Worldwide evidence suggests pollinator populations are declining due many factors, including habitat destruction. Honeybee numbers in North America have been declining over the past 10 years due to parasitic tracheal and Varroa mites; so making space for native bees guards against dependence on a single species. Fortunately, most native bees are immune from mite attack.

Bees are fun to observe.

Wait, watch and you will see a bee forage, collect pollen or sip nectar from flowers. Bees, like birds and butterflies and many other animals in our yards, give us a sense of pleasure. You may be wondering, "Aren't bees dangerous? Don't they sting?" Most bees don't sting, and few species defend their nest (bumblebees are an exception). Bees generally only use their stingers in defense. No need to fear being stung if you move slowly and nonaggressively. Did you know that only females are capable of stinging? (Males of all bee species lack this capacity).

Lemon Bay Conservancy recently installed pollinator houses to their butterfly habitat in hopes to provide shelter for some of the bees they may invite:

- Bumble bees social, large, fuzzy, noisy flight, boisterous
- Honeybees social, busy, smaller and less fuzzy than

bumble bees

- Other Apidae species social, large stingless bees
- Halictid bees solitary, small, black or metallic colored bees, includes sweat bees and nomia hees
- Megachilid bees solitary, often metallic blue or black, includes leaf- cutter bees and orchard mason bees.

What can you do to attract these pollinators?

Native bees and other pollinators are more attracted to native plants than exotics. "Natives" occur naturally in a specific region; meaning simply that they were not introduced either intentionally or unintentionally to the area by humans or animals. Bees especially love these species of Plant Families:

- Asteraceae Daisy, Aster, Sunflower family (Gaillardia grandiflora, Bidens ferufolia, Coreopsis grandiflora, Cosmos binnatus, Helianthus annuus)
- Fabaceae Legume family
- Lamiaceae Mint, Lavender, Salvia family (Agastache and Lavandula species, Salvia uliginosa)
- Polygonaceae Buckwheat family Rosaceae – Rose, Apple, Cherry, Strawberry, Raspberry family Scrophulariaceae -Snapdragon, Penstemon family (Hebe species, Linaria purpurea)
- Other species Eryngium species (carrot family), Geranium incanum (Geranium family), Phacelia tanacetifolia (waterfall family), Caryopteris

species (verbena family), Sedum species.

Many of the wild bees you may encounter in your backyard garden make their burrow homes in the soil or in holes in trees You can also encourage beeresidents by providing nesting blocks. Creating homes for bees is a surprisingly simple and easy thing you can do. Some bees create hives in snags (a dead or dying standing tree, often with its branches broken off), or in holes in trees. You can also encourage bee-residents by providing man-made nesting blocks or "Bee Condos."



Bee House

Here is how to build a "Bee Condo" for your native bees.

- Materials You Will Need: • A 4"x6" or 6"x6" dried pine or fir post (or you can try a weathered fence post or other scrap wood)
- Drill and drill bits, a variety of diameters, ranging from 1/4 in. to 3/8 in.
- Paper straws not plastic (available at some hardware stores, or through a scientific supply store), or small hollow bamboo sticks, with one end

How to Construct: 1. Cut the wooden posts into blocks 8-12 in. long.

- 2. Drill holes into the wood blocks using a variety of hole diameters from 1/4 in. to 3/8 in. Drill holes 3-5 in. deep, and at least 3/4 in. apart. Smooth out ragged edges of holes.
- 3. Alternatively, a bundle of paper straws or hollow sticks, with one end sealed, will make an attractive bee home.

- 4. Bees prefer dark colored homes, so consider charring the front of your "Bee Condo" lightly with a torch.
- 5. Mount your "Bee Condo" on a post or attach to the side of a building. Place nesting blocks so that tunnels are horizontal. Make sure they are in a warm location with southern exposure and protected from rain. A good place could be under the eaves of a garage or shed.
- 6. If you don't want to build your own "Bee Condo," consider these commercial sources for bee nests: knoxcellars. com, raintreenursery. com, entomologic.com, pollinatorparadise.com, or superseeds.com/birds_&_more.



Sentinel Chickens Thwart Deadly Viral Diseases

Not far from the Peace River and I-75, a lovely, mild-mannered, flock of some 75 Easter Egg Chickens recently prepared to stand sentinel between the population of Charlotte County and three deadly mosquitoborne diseases. During the first week of June, the chickens were distributed in groups of three among seven county sites, where their actual work will begin, alerting county officials if mosquitos carrying any of these deadly diseases show up here: West Nile Virus, St. Louis Encephalitis, Eastern Equine Encephalitis.

How do they do it and why chickens?

Explains Charlotte County Director of Mosquito and Aquatic Weed Control Scott Schermerhorn, "Chickens are dead end hosts for these viruses, meaning they can be bit by a mosquito carrying the virus but they won't get sick and they won't take the virus to another host." He said the chickens are tested weekly for the viruses and thanks to them, the county does not have to do unnecessary chemical spraying against the three diseases until alerted by a positive result.

The sentinel chicken season is roughly June through December, when mosquitoes are most active in southwest Florida. Each January, the flock is replenished with arrival of viral-virgin young chicks from Ohio. Actually managing the flock under Schermerhorn are Biological Specialists Sydney L'Heureux and Beth Kovach.

The good news is no chickens are harmed while doing their duty! In fact, being a sentinel chicken can be a cushy life! Many of the county's chicken

"cooperators" (hosts) at the seven sites spoil their sentinels. In exchange for a location to place the chickens and access as needed, the county provides the chicken coop, feed, and, of course, the chickens. The cooperators get to keep the eggs. If a chicken happens to test positive for one of the deadly viruses, it is removed from the test site and replaced with a virally sterile chicken.

The chicken that is no longer useful as a sentinel might be donated to a 4-H'er as a project or join some resident's flock.

The county's Sentinel Chicken Ambassador, Lavender, was once on the sentinel front lines until she tested virus positive. It so happens that Easter Egg chickens get their name for their colorful blue, green and pink eggs.

Ambassador Lavender was so named because she was lavender colored as a young pullet.

The sentinel chicken program began in the 1980s in Florida with an ugly outbreak of St. Louis Encephalitis. In Charlotte County, the Department of Public Works administers the program with funding included in its biannual budget. The program is not just limited to Florida, however; even states with arid climates administer sentinel chicken programs because large cities can have increased mosquito populations,

substitute for the constant public education reminder for residents to empty all standing water where mosquitoes love to breed!)

In a large county the size of Charlotte that runs from coastal to inland, there are 40 resilient and formidable mosquito breeds that run the gamut of disease carrying, terrain breeding and time of day feeding. Some mosquitoes even specialize in the area of the human body

As Florida statute specifies, a certain threshold of mosquitos must be reached or exceeded before

they like to bite!

spraying can be done in an area, it is important that Charlotte County Mosquito Control utilize every tool in its arsenal to take the battle to the mosquitos, every day, wherever they find them. If cute, fluffy chickens become an unlikely, but potent weapon in the fight against disease, thwarting mosquitoes and saving humans from deathly illness -

not to mention red bumps and miserable itching - then Hooray for Sentinel Chickens!
