

EPIC Community Resource Center

Here for the People

Englewood is a community split between two counties and, as such, it often falls between the cracks when organizations choose a location, opting to establish itself in a "real" town like Venice, North Port, Port Charlotte, or Punta Gorda. Englewood residents have the same needs as other locales; but if an individual is limited by a lack of transportation or live outside a service area, they lose

Now, however, thanks to an individual's directive from his Lord, and assisted by an increasing army of volunteers, those with unmet needs in Englewood have a local source for help and resources. **EPIC Community Resource** Center, a 501(c)(3) faith-based Christian nonprofit, has opened to serve those suffering and in need of assistance, whether it be physical, emotional or spiritual, through the power of Christ. EPIC stands for "Empowering People in Christ". It is not affiliated with any church. Its vision is helping others find true freedom and a healthy,

President and CEO Ronnie Jackson points out that the Sarasota County Health Assessment of 2019 and the County Mental Health Needs Task Force Report of January, 2022 identified mental health wellness as a key finding in the county, followed by alcohol addiction, suicide, and drug addiction. To



help meet these needs, EPIC partners with area organizations such as Jesus Loves You Ministry (a nonprofit outreach to the homeless and at-risk homeless); On the Spot Aid, Inc. (a nonprofit that offers first aid and wound care to the homeless); Marah Mutual (provides financial education and assistance with budgeting); Operation Solid7 (an outreach that provides support and resources for veterans, active duty, first responders, and Gold Star families); and Veterans Service of Sarasota and Charlotte Counties, who will have an office there with a staff member to assist veterans in learning about and applying for available benefits.

EPIC seeks to serve all age groups from children to seniors. For seniors, there is a social group, "Friends Finding Friends" for ages 55+. The facility has opened its space as a meeting location for support groups such as Celebrate Recovery, AA & NA meetings, spiritual healing, Bible study, and offers case management for human services needs with assistance and referrals. A wellness education group, Healing Strong, is currently underway for those dealing with cancer or chronic illness to learn about natural healing and nutrition choices, as well as provide emotional support. "In These Days" is a class for those suffering from depression, anxiety, fear, and loneliness, to learn how to change those feelings into positive emotions. For youth, there are upcoming programs such as Trail Life® for Boys (learning outdoor skills, character-building, citizenship, and friendship through fun activities and instructions) and American Heritage Girls® (girls learn new skills, have outdoor adventures, learn leadership, and develop character through Christian programming).

Founder Ronnie Jackson is a man who has a personal relationship with God and listens when his Lord speaks to him. In 2021, God directed him to use

a meeting to address community needs, he learned about the lack of resources in Englewood as an underserved community. The vision of creating a location where people could receive support and learn about resources available to them was developed by a group of volunteers and EPIC was incorporated as a nonprofit charity in January, 2022. A building site was acquired, but the remodeling was delayed when Hurricane Ian struck and the volunteers chose to go out in the community to help those in need first.

The renovation of the building located at 655 N. Indiana Avenue is now completed. The building offers two meeting areas for groups, offices for partner organizations, a kitchen, a sitting area for chatting, and a recoup area that will be used by On the Spot, Inc. to offer a daytime lounge for those recovering from an injury or wound who don't have a roof over their head. It will also provide wound care follow-up and two overnight rooms to house those who were just released from the hospital without a place to spend the night while they continue to

EPIC Community Resource Center is a growing, dynamic organization that will provide the residents of Englewood with much needed services and resources. 



While reading the *Englewood Review* you may have been wondering, "Where is Amanda Glam? I miss her desperately and have no idea what to see at the movies or watch on TV without her sage advice." Or you may not have noticed my absence at all. That's OK, I forgive you.

This month your Amanda has left Florida after more than 25 years for an undisclosed location that begins with New and ends with Mexico. Spoiler alert: moving is time consuming and stressful and leaves you with little time for movies and television.

I have finally had the opportunity to visit one of my two local movie theaters, and since it is the Halloween season, I decided on *A Haunting in Venice* (PG-13). This is the third Agatha Christie adaptation from director Kenneth Branagh, who also stars as Christie's iconic mustachioed Belgian detective Hercule Poirot.

Set in 1947 Venice, *Haunting* is based on Christie's novel *Hallowe'en Party* and finds Poirot retired from sleuthing and living as a happy (well as much as Poirot can be happy) recluse. A friend, American mystery writer Ariadne Oliver (Tina Fey) convinces Poirot to attend a Halloween party and seance at a palazzo owned by retired opera singer Rowena Drake, played by *Yellowstone*'s Kelly Reilly. I mean really, how do you say no to that?

The palazzo is as creepy and imposing as a palazzo can get, and it's supposedly haunted by the ghosts of orphans who were left to die there during the plague. Oh, and there's a massive and very atmospheric thunderstorm happening. This is no jaunty *Murder on the Orient Express*.

After a Halloween party for the current batch of orphans, a very skeptical Poirot and company are invited to a seance led by the famous medium Mrs. Reynolds (Michelle Yeoh). She has been hired by Rowena to call forth the spirit of her daughter Alicia who died





under, you guessed it, unusual circumstances.

When another murder and an attempt on Poirot's life occurs, everyone gathered at the palazzo is a suspect. They include housekeeper Olga Seminoff (is Christie great at names or what?) Alicia's former fiancé Maxime Gerard, and an emotionally fragile surgeon and his exceptionally precocious son, reuniting Jamie Dornan and Jude Hill, who starred in Branagh's Oscar-winning film *Belfast*.

Poirot's investigation is complicated by those nasty spirits inhabiting the palazzo. A devout non-believer, the detective actually witnesses some very unnatural and disturbing occurrences that even he can't explain.

In a cast where everyone delivers exactly what they need to, standouts are unsurprisingly, Oscar-winner Yeoh and Reilly,

who as the grieving mother, gets the most to work with. Fey is also impressive taking a leap from her standard comedic roles.

A Haunting in Venice feels more like Orson Welles' The Third Man or at times, Nicolas Roeg's relentlessly atmospheric Venice-set horror film *Don't Look* Now, than it does Branagh's two previous Poirot outings. It's darker, smarter, scarier and much less formulaic. It also clocks in at a tidy 107 minutes. I wasn't even close to figuring out whodunit or howtheydunit. A Haunting in Venice is an absorbing and expertly-crafted mystery, delivering thrills and chills without the blood and gore of traditional modern Halloween

Watching A Haunting in Venice did inspire me to check out Brangh's Death on the Nile, (released in 2022 after a long delay), a much more traditional Poirot vehicle set mostly on a spectacular riverboat sailing on the Nile. Poirot has joined revelers celebrating the marriage of fabulously wealthy and gorgeous Linnet Ridgeway (Gal Gadot) and fabulously tanned Simon Doyle (Armie Hammer, pre-scandal). The one uninvited guest is Jacqueline, Simon's former fiancé and Linnet's former best friend. Ouch.

My problem with Death on the Nile (PG-13) is that there are so many characters/suspects that actors like Annette Bening and the charming Tom Bateman have very little to do. Also, unlike Haunting, I figured out who the killer was pretty early on, making the reveal a bit underwhelming. Indeed, the most compelling scene in the film might be the opening, a World War I battle scene of a young Poirot that offers insight into the detective's character and beliefs. Death on the Nile isn't great but it is entertaining and a diverting



Community Rocks!!

How Rock Painting Brings Our Community Together

On the surface, rock painting sounds like yet another craft project, but if you take a closer look underneath the paint, you will discover a whole new way to reconnect with the outside world. Painting rocks may have become popular over the last several years, but the practice has actually been around for thousands of years. Painted pebbles date back from the period of the late Ice Age and beginning of the Holocene, according to the Archaeological Heritage Office in Dresden, Germany.


Painted pebbles were given a renewed sense of purpose in these modern times due in part by Megan Murphy, a Massachusetts-based women's empowerment coach who

founded The Kindness Rocks Project as a meaningful way to give back to her community. Her mission is brilliant in its simplicity: decorate rocks with vibrant designs and inspiring messages, mark them with a distinguishing hashtag, hide and scatter them everywhere possible in an effort to uplift the people who find them. Neuroscience research suggests that the person who finds your surprise gift might experience a surge of mood-boosting neurological brain chemicals.

Studies indicate that

a sense of community is foundational for our feelings of safety and security as humans.

Anyone who finds a rock is encouraged to take a photo of it and then use the hashtag to connect with other rock painting enthusiasts on social media sites. The rock finder can then either replace the rock with one that they have painted themselves or hide the one they found in a new location. These kindness



rocks have been a worldwide phenomenon ever since.

Rock painting is more than a relaxing and fulfilling ritual. Mindfulness and creativity are both important components of art therapy - many use it as a way to manage their anxiety and stress. When we engage


in activities, like rock painting, that require our focus in a gentle, mindful way, we benefit on both psychological and physical levels. Our empathy towards one another increases when we offer a kind word or gesture that communicates to others that they are not alone.

The process of mapping out a pebble design and executing your masterpiece undoubtedly keeps your mind focused on the task at hand, distracting it from outside stressors and temporarily relieving anxiety and worries. On a more scientific neurobiological level, calm-inducing GABA (gamma aminobutyric acid) levels increase every

time we engage in mindfulnessbased tasks. The mind and body also benefit from increased levels of serotonin, a feel-good neurochemical, as well as dopamine, which is often called the brain's primary rewarder of neurochemicals.

The rock garden at Lemon Creek Wildflower Preserve was established in order to provide members of our local community with an opportunity to experience these benefits for themselves. Each month, Lemon Bay Conservancy facilitates a rock painting workshop at the Preserve. You are invited to join us for the next rock garden painting session on Wednesday, November 29 at 5pm at the outdoor classroom area in the meadow at Lemon Creek Wildflower Preserve located at 3120 Gasparilla Pines Boulevard, Englewood, FL 34224. We will provide paint, brushes, some cocktail napkins, mod podge for decoupage, and several different types of acrylic pens for group use. New techniques, such as working with colored glue, using cake decorating tips, and metal paint, will also be explored. Instructor Bonnie Stuhlmiller is always happy to assist in picking out rocks with natural character. Everyone is welcome to participate and join us for our monthly guided labyrinth walk following the session.
